Foreword

Uganda's civic space has been on a decline in the past ten years, limiting the enjoyment of rights and freedoms and citizens participation in their governance. New legislations have been enacted to target non-state actors in the governance sector and human rights activists, and as a result many people have been tortured, arrested and severely assaulted, leaving permanent health damages for journalists, activists, opposition supporters and loss of property which is confiscated by security operatives. The music concerts by artists, whose sing conscience music, have been cancelled and yet several artists are rounded off and some are detained and denied their performing rights.

During the process of amending constitution to remove age limit in 2017, CSO governance and human rights organizations were sieged by Police and their accounts closed by the Financial Intelligence Authority. The same acts are beginning to repeat themselves with the upcoming elections in sight. It's important to note that during the 2016 elections, government created situation scenarios where citizens were living in fear and were being intimidated from expressing themselves, as a result, several shunned the election activity. All these are contributing factors that point to the bigger problem facing the civic space and the narrowing gap between government and the citizens.

It's important for civic actors' stakeholders to coordinate the efforts and work together to safeguard the civic space in Uganda. The civil societies in governance have a role to play in identifying the civic issues to engage government and mobilize citizens to reclaim the civic space. This is to enable them participate and demand for their freedoms effectively in the democratic processes of the nation that will affect future generations.

CSO leaders have continuous engagements with the NGO Bureau and ministry of internal affairs leadership on the issues concerning civic space but the trend continues in the negative line. Stakeholders in CSO leaders converged to share the shrinking civic space issues as an East Africa bloc where all countries noted the restrictive laws to crack down on their activities as a major threat.

Partnership engagements

Project implementation under Action Aid Uganda

Background:

The project sought to promote and increase youth participation in elections by creating civic awareness and implementing, youth focused interventions for increased young people participation in electoral related activities. The project further sought to make the citizen central in electoral cycles by petitioning courts of all for creation of provisions for recall of Members of Parliament (MPs) in a multi - party dispensation.

Activities

Implemented activities involved holding of online engagements on youths and elections using webinars and twitter chats as well as procuring legal services for research and litigation on provisions for the recall of MPs from Parliament; accreditation for election observation and training of election observers.

Tweet chat held on 13^h August 2020 on youth participation in elections: The specific objectives of the tweet chat were to: create awareness about special interest groups electoral rules and regulations; answer questions surrounding the youth movement by the current National Youth Council leadership and challenges faced by youth in political participation. Project implementation under Open Society Initiative for East Africa (OSIE)

Background

Covid-19 situation report released by the Health ministry on 9/12/2020, shows we have accumulated 23,200 of Covid-19 cases and 207 deaths. The Minister for Health on the 30th of September 2020 Jane Ruth Aceng received medical equipment worth USD 250,000 to boost the COVID-19 response. Covid-19 equipment were procured by WHO Uganda. This equipment was supposed to be deployed at the regional referral hospitals across the country however there was no evidence that it happened due to poor accountability of the funds. Apart from this the ministry of health received more than one trillion Ugandan shillings towards the covid19 fight. But to our dismay there has been little to no credible accountability of those funds.

The Health ministry says the community cases have been reported in 40 districts so far, but Amuru and Kyotera districts are some of the most affected in addition to rising cases in Kampala, among the army and refugees. Experts link the increasing cases in the community to laxity among members of the public, poor hygiene practices and the onset of the political season. Dr. Henry Kajumbula, the head of Covid-19 prevention and control in the team of scientists, said most Ugandans have not taken the pandemic with required seriousness.

During the national update, the experts decried actions of leaders, who are being sighted conducting political activities without observing prevention measures such as social distancing and wearing face masks. Recently we have seen the ministry calling to Ugandans to be more careful now that there have been fewer restrictions to the current nationwide lockdown.

The Project on sought to empower human rights defenders/ civic actors (artists, activists, bloggers, and investigative journalists) to defend and protect Civic Space in Uganda. The target was to reach-out to activists/journalists/artists as actors in each of the regions with a gender balance perspective. The hot spots would where Kampala (Central), Gulu (North), Mbarara (West) and Mbale (East) as regional focal points.

Press conferences on emerging civic space issues in Uganda

UCC on 7th September 2020 issued a Public Notice reminding online date communication and broadcasters including blogger, online televisions online radio online newspaper audio over IP-internet protocol TV, Video on demand, Digital Audio Radio and Television, Internet /Web audio and Television to obtain authorization from UCC before providing such services to the public by 5th October 2020.

After this we responded with a press conference at Center for Constitutional Governance headquarters on Sunday 13th September 2020 at 10:00 am with a press conference with some of the issues:

That UCC's act of issuing such a notice three months to a scientific campaign for the national general elections, will deter many aspiring candidates from using online media space to share information with their would be electorates. In the end it will prevent citizens from access useful information that informs their choice on who to vote and thus

prevent them from enjoying their right to vote. That UCC's notice for seeking authorization, confirms fears that legislation such as the Communications Act 2013 the Anti-Terrorism Act of 2002 and its subsequent incarnations, the Regulation of Interception of Communications Act of 2010, the Computer Misuse Act of 2011, the Public Order Management Act of 2013, the Anti-Money Laundering Act of 2013, the Anti-Pornography Act of 2014 and the Nongovernmental Organizations Act of 2016 serves to confirm our suspicions. Such action by regulators undermine efforts to foster positive mutual and constructive relations between the regulator and those they regulate as required in the state and citizens relationship

The National Bureau for Non-Governmental Organizations (NGO Bureau) under the Ministry of Internal Affairs, on October 29th 2020 issued a statement where among others strongly cautioned Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs). The NGOs that were cautioned include those that are registered with the NGO Bureau and don't appear in the Uganda National NGO Register (UNNR); those operating loose coalitions and continue to operate without legalizing their status; those registered with the NGO Bureau and host organizations that have “not legalized their status, “since such arrangements are illegal”; the bureau also called upon stakeholders to avoid any engagements with organizations that have


not legalized their status under the laws of Uganda.
